Learning Outcome Statement

The pediatric registered nurse will have the necessary knowledge and skills to provide initial care to the critically ill or injured pediatric patient until critical care consultation is obtained by recognizing critical illnesses, effectively managing acute deterioration and post resuscitation, and identifying the need for a patient to transfer to an appropriate critical care environment.

Other Requirements

Successful PFCCS course completion requires that the participant attend all components of the course, complete the online pre-test before attending the course. Post-test will be online and pass with a score of 70% or better. Participants must bring a personal electronic device.

Who Should Attend?

The Pediatric Fundamental Critical Care Support (PFCCS) is designed to prepare healthcare providers caring for unstable, critically ill, or injured pediatric patients. Likely participants include:

- Hospitalists caring for potentially unstable, critically ill or injured pediatric patients.
- Advanced practice nurses and physician assistants with limited pediatric practice.
- Rapid response/medical emergency team members.
- Pediatric critical care fellows beginning their training.
- Emergency medicine physicians who do not routinely care for pediatric patients.
- Nurses caring for complex and potentially unstable pediatric patients.
- Pre-hospital providers and transport teams who are involved with the transport of pediatric patients.
