

What Else Re: Experience:

Every nurse and admin person we encountered once we entered the hospital floor was so courteous and helpful. My son has special needs and no one made any assumptions about his level of understanding or cooperation. I was asked a lot of questions relevant to his care and comfort and I felt like they were actually considering my answers and providing even more support. A nurse named Anna was especially wonderful and responsive once we left recovery and my son was having nausea and getting agitated. I know day surgery gets you in early so the doctors aren't waiting, but nothing about the timing or the wait feit out of line. His procedure even started a bit early. I felt very informed of where we were in the process at all times and I really love the number system to be able to track my boy through the process in the waiting room. The volunteer Connor was very very nice. I had some worries about being under general anesthesia and my boy's reaction to all of the unfamiliar things, but I really couldn't have been more satisfied with this whole process. I'm so grateful that was our experience as first-timers with special needs.





Our Beautiful Piano is back!

In December our 111 year old piano was returned to us, fully cleaned, repaired, and ready to provide music for listeners as they walked through the Pavilion hallway.

It has been a joy to watch patients, family members as well as hospital staff and volunteers stop for a minute to listen. Not only was the inside completely rebuilt, the outside was sealed, ebony stained and polished.

Using twenty first century technology, this piano can not only be played live

by an individual, but also is programmed by the QRS app that brings the twentieth century piano roll player into use at the touch of button. Hundreds of pre-recorded songs can be played.

We are working on how to get local pianists to donate their time to come to the lobby and share live music. In the meantime, stop and listen as the piano is played through its digital system.


